Stuart will have a one on one discussion with Alison about the skin cancer issues he has faced over the years and the importance for everyone in the golf industry to protect themselves against the sun.

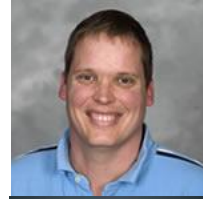

DRIVING

From **Edinburgh** take the M8 to Newbridge interchange and follow signposts to M9 (Stirling) and continue along before taking exit to Dunblane. Drive for half a mile on the dual carriageway before taking the 3rd exit at the roundabout with the hotel 200 yards to the right.

From **Glasgow** take the M8 motorway and follow signs for the M80 (Stirling). Stay on the M80 until you see the sign for Dunblane, then take the 3rd exit at the roundabout before driving for half a mile on the dual carriageway before taking the 3rd exit at the roundabout with the hotel 200 yards to the right.

From the **South** follow signs for M74 (Glasgow) and M73 (Stirling) before taking the directions as noted above from Glasgow.

From the **North** follow signs for Perth taking the A9 south towards Glasgow. Take the first exit for Dunblane following the road signs to the town centre. The hotel is one mile on your left after leaving the junction.

TRAIN STATION

When exiting the train station turn right and walk towards the main road. Turn left and continue up the main road passing the police station on your left. Take the exit for Perth Road at the roundabout with the hotel 200 yards on your right.
