## Module 3 WHAT - Pitching /Bunker HOW-TO -Observation and analysis

# Module 4 WHAT – Full swing HOW-TO – Feedback

- Apply rules and etiquette appropriate to the shot
- Conduct fun and safe games
- Receive tutor-led feedback

### Pathway to Certificate in Coaching Golf

All coaches must be an accredited Golf Coaching Assistant to progress onto the Certificate in Coaching Golf qualification.

In order to progress onto the Certificate in Coaching Golf qualification, coaches will be expected to evidence a log of 30 hours applied coaching practice.

Coaches will be expected to gather evidence of the activities/ sessions they have delivered. This evidence can be recorded in their Coaching Log Book.

Each activity should be prepared, delivered and evaluated with appropriate feedback recorded and action plans produced.

Coaches should continuously review and evaluate their own practice.

### Assessment and accreditation - Coaches must:

- be assessed delivering a simulated 15 mins coaching session. If coaches demonstrate competence this will be credited. Coaches failing to demonstrate competence across the range will be given one further opportunity to do so.
- produce a recorded evaluation of the assessed coaching practice.
- sit a MCQ (multiple choice questionnaire) to assess knowledge and understanding of golf theory e.g. coaching scenarios, sports science, rules and regulations, etiquette.
