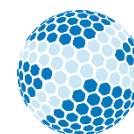


SCOTTISH MIXED CHAMPIONSHIP

TERMS OF THE COMPETITION

Handicap Limit: 54
Entry Fee: Free

1. Eligibility

The Scottish Mixed Championship is open to all members of Scottish Golf affiliated clubs who meet all the following criteria:

- Are of amateur status as defined by R&A Rules Limited.
- Are in possession of a WHS Handicap Index.
- Have been identified by their golf club as the top available pair from their club qualifying round.

2. General

- Club qualifying rounds are run in accordance with R&A Rules of Golf and in conjunction with the club's own local rules. The Grand Final will be run in accordance with the R&A Rules of Golf and in conjunction with the Scottish Golf Hard card and any amendments published by Scottish Golf at the venue.
- All affiliated clubs are invited to schedule a mixed foursome stableford qualifying competition. Qualifying competitions may be standalone or attached to an existing mixed foursome stableford fixture.
- Members of more than 1 club may compete in the qualifying round at each affiliated club where they are a member.
- [Ready Golf](#) will be encouraged at all stages of the championship.

3. Format

Club Qualifying

- The qualifying round shall consist of 18 holes of mixed foursomes stableford.
- Men must play from their normal medal competition tees (White or Medal) and ladies from their normal medal tees. Men must tee off first on the odd holes.
- Handicap allowance will be half the combined Course Handicaps, including 50% of the multi tee adjustment, with the team handicap rounded to the nearest whole number. See page 44 of the [CONGU Advice Document](#).
- The ladies stroke indices and pars will be used for purpose of calculating all strokes received.
- The committee is responsible for running their qualifying competition and deciding ties at their club.
- The top 40 pairs based on stableford scores from club qualifying rounds will qualify for the Grand Final on Friday 16 September over Gullane No.1. If over-subscribed a waiting list will be maintained in score order. Any ties for the 40th qualifying place and ordering of subsequent reserve places will be decided by lot.

Grand Final

- The Grand Final shall consist of 18 holes of mixed foursomes stableford.
- Men must play from white tees and ladies from red tees. Men must tee off first on the odd holes.
- Handicap allowance will be half the combined Course Handicaps, including 50% of the multi tee adjustment, with the team handicap rounded to the nearest whole number.
- In the event of a tie for the winning pair or any subsequent places a card countback on the stableford points for the last 9 holes (or 6 or 3 or 1) will be used to decide ties. If a tie still arises, the last 6 holes of the first 9 holes (or 3 or 1) will be used. If no decision is reached, a card play-off from the 1st hole will apply, failing which; the winner will be decided by lot.
- If, in the opinion of Scottish Golf, it becomes impossible to complete a championship in accordance with that championship's Terms of the Competition, because of adverse weather or other circumstances, Scottish Golf reserves the right to amend the championship format to the extent necessary to achieve a result within the time available.
- All disputes will be decided by Scottish Golf whose decision will be final.

4. Entries

- All entries must be completed by one partner by the closing date with the 'pairs qualifying score' and 'partners name' included in the notes section of each entry.
- Entry can be made on the [Scottish Golf App](#) or online at [Scottishgolf.org](#).
- It is the entrant's responsibility to ensure their WHS Handicap Index is up to date at all times.

- d) Correspondence will be sent to the email provided at time of entry 2 weeks prior to the Grand Final.
- e) Scottish Golf will not be responsible for any correspondence that fails to reach competitors.
- f) All entries are subject to the approval of Scottish Golf who reserve the right to refuse or accept or, having accepted, subsequently reject any entry.

5. Withdrawals

Withdrawals will only be accepted if a player withdraws through the Scottish Golf App or written confirmation is received in to events@scottishgolf.org

6. Grand Final Registration

ALL teams must register at the at least 60 minutes prior to their start time. Failure to do so may result in a team forfeiting their place in the field.

7. Substitutions

In the event of a player(s) being unable to compete in the Grand Final the next available pair from the reserve list will be invited.

8. Trophies

All trophies awarded at championships shall be retained by Scottish Golf. Any player not present at the prize presentation who has failed to notify Scottish Golf will not be presented with their prize.
